Mayor Bennett asked for clarification if the Rural Coalition/ World Farmers and Farmworkers Self-help would work together with the Farmworkers Association, as they both seem to have the same goals for the Community Garden. Mr. Moreno confirmed.

Maria Valdivia, area coordinator for the Farmworkers Association elaborated on the current transition with their Administration that occurred and some issues encountered during that

98 99	process. She elaborated that they are willing to work with the Rural Coalition as this will benefit the whole Community.

101	Discussion ensued about a three (3) year contract that is in effect with the prior FWA and		
102	Mrs. Spelorzi will check the expiration date.

104	Councilmember Cardenas felt that more communication between the two organizations i		
105	necessary and that both of them working together will be a great benefit for the Town.

107	Councilmember Leonhard inquired about who is in possession of the key to the property and

110	Mayor Bennett spoke on creating an agreement and both organizations are partial to that		
111	suggestion. It was suggested that Councilmember Cardenas work with both groups to come		
112	up with an arrangement and she accepted.

114	Councilmember Tom Larrivee made the motion to form a committee with		
115	representatives from both organizations and to have Councilmember Cardenas be the		
116	Town's representative. Findings are to be presented to the Council once an agreement		
117	has been reached; seconded by Councilmember Gray Leonhard.

123	insurance requirements and to have rules and policies in place before the new Center opens.

125	Resident Sue Elliott, Minshew Rd, agrees with the importance for having a board dedicated		
126	to the new Town Center to use it to its fullest potential.		
127			
128	Discussion ensued that about the timetable for opening the new Town Center.		
129			
130	Vice Mayor Greenland and Councilmember Leonhard feel that a board may not be necessary,		
131	and to have folks address the Council with suggestions and recommendations pertaining to		
132	the Town Center.		
133			
134	Councilmember Cardenas stated that if the Council is not in favor of a Board she would		
135	recommend getting help for Mrs. Spelorzi as there are additional duties that will fall on her		
136	once the Town Center opens.		
137			
138	Resident Robin Greene respectfully asked the Council to reconsider creating a Board because		
139	a lot of residents are not comfortable going before the Council.		
140			
141	Mrs. Sue Elliott spoke on the process the TPO uses for suggestion and idea gathering for		
142	projects, which is very informal and those ideas go back before the TPO during a meeting and		
143	are being voted on. This gets the residents in the Community to come together and make		
144	suggestions to help their Community.

146 147 148	Mr. Paul Martel, 506 N. Pine feels that a Board may not be needed at this time and if people feel their concerns or suggestions are important enough they will speak before the Council.
