Mr. Waugh stated that this stipulation needs to be adopted as a policy, so that renters are aware at time of rental. Discussion ensued about raising the security deposit.

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Mrs. Richardson stated that hedges blocking view on Row at corner of Richardson and
Hagstrom, it's a safety issue. Discussion ensued that the Town can trim.
