

TOWN COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

TUESDAY, MAY 24, 2022 – 7:00 PM PIERSON TOWN HALL

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1. Call meeting to order

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Mayor Samuel G.S. Bennett called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM and asked Town Clerk Carmen Spelorzi to take the roll call.

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2. Roll call

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3. Invocation and pledge of allegiance

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Mayor Samuel Bennett gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

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4. Approval of Minutes – Mayor Samuel Bennett

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a. Regular Meeting May 10, 2022

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Mayor Bennett asked if there were any additions and deletions if not he would entertain a motion.

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Councilmember Gray Leonhard noted a scrivener's error under paragraph f. on page 2 of 4 that needs to be corrected as follows:

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Town <u>Planner</u> not present corrected to Town <u>Attorney</u> not present

Councilmember Leonhard also stated that the minutes indicate that the item for discussion to join with all Cities on VSO pursuit of an initiative on Opioids was supposed to be added to the 5/24/22 agenda and it appears that did not happen.

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Councilmember Gray Leonhard made the motion to approve the minutes with the correction listed above; seconded by Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund. All agreed; motion carries.

a. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF PIERSON, FLORIDA RELATING TO THE AMENDMENT OF THE TOWN OF PIERSON COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF A SMALL SCALE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT FOR REAL PROPERTY TOTALING APPROXIMATELY 14,000 ± SF IN SIZE LOCATED ON THE NORTH SIDE OF PALMETTO AVENUE, EAST OF NORTH VOLUSIA AVENUE AKA C R 3 AND WEST OF THE FLORIDA COAST RAILWAY AND US HIGHWAY 17 NORTH WITH ADDRESS OF 120 WEST PALMETTO AVENUE WITHIN THE TOWN OF PIERSON: PROVIDING FOR A CHANGE IN THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP DESIGNATION FROM TOWN OF PIERSON AGRICULTURAL AND RESIDENTIAL TO TOWN OF PIERSON MEDIUM DENSITY MOBILE HOME USE; INCLUDING CONFORMANCE OF THE FUTURE LAND USE OF THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO THE ADOPTED AMENDMENT; REPEALING ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

145	roll call vote 4-0.
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147	e. Planning Commission recommendation to Council to consider the possible change of
148	alcohol sales on Sunday – Town Planner Mark Karet, Zev Cohen & Associates
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150	Mr. Karet spoke on the history of prior meetings, where this item was discussed by the Town
151	Council as well as the Planning and Zoning Commission. Mr. Karet stated that the P&Z
152	recommends the Town Council consider repealing the Blue Law prohibiting the sale of any
153	alcohol on Sundays, which can become an economic development issue.
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155	Business owners and other audience members shared their pro and con views on this matter.
156	Discussion ensued.
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158	Councilmember Gray Leonhard made the motion to direct the Town Attorney to draft
159	an Ordinance for allowing Alcohol sales on Sundays after 12:01 PM; seconded by
160	Councilmember Sergia Cardenas. Motion carries on roll call vote 3-1, with Mayor
161	Bennett casting the dissenting vote.
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163	f. Discussion on the parking area at the community center at Chipper Jones Park
164	— Gray Leonhard, Councilman
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166	Councilmember Gray Leonhard spoke on the work that has been done to improve the parking
167	area at Chipper Jones Park, but that issues still exist. Discussion ensued about the
168	improvements that have previously been approved and a possibly timeline to get those
169	completed.
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171	g. Property Appraisal for Insurance at the New Town Center for General Liability
172	with PGIT/ Preferred/ PRIA – Mayor Samuel G.S. Bennett
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174	Mayor Bennett opened this item up for discussion and Mr. Waugh advised that from a legal
175	perspective, he would recommend the Town consider insurance. Discussion ensued.
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177	Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund made the motion to accept the \$11,393 annual premium
178	from B+B for the General Liability with PGIT/ Preferred/ PRIA; seconded by
179	Councilmember Gray Leonhard. All agreed; motion carries.
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181	h. <u>Taylor Middle-High School Saturday, November 12, 2022, Wildcats 5K Run</u>
182	Sponsorship - Mayor Samuel G.S. Bennett
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184	Mayor Bennett introduced Mr. Gavin Mueller, Athletic Coach and Traylor Middle-High, who
185	spoke on the history of the program and explained the process of the sponsorships.
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187 188 189	Discussion ensued about starting an athletic booster club to help and the successes of the Soccer and volleyball teams.
190 191 192 193	Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund made the motion to authorize a sponsorship in the amount of \$500 for the Wildcat 5K run; seconded by Councilmember Gray Leonhard. All agreed; motion carries.
194	i. Approval for use of contractor Donald Bowen - Mayor Samuel G.S. Bennett
195 196 197	Mayor Bennett praised the work of contractor Donald Bowen and recommended the Council approve him to do work on an as needed basis.
198 199 200 201 202	Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund made the motion to approve the use of contractor Donald Bowen for carpentry work as needed at a rate of \$65.00 for an annual amount not to exceed \$34,000; seconded by Councilmember Gray Leonhard. All agreed; motion carries.
203204205206	j. Approval of a stove and refrigerator for new town center community center/cafeteria - Mayor Samuel G.S. Bennett
207 208 209 210 211 212	Mayor Bennett stated that staff has been diligently working to get closer to moving into the New Community center and getting everything ready to be able to rent out spaces. Mayor Bennett continued about getting a new stove and refrigerator for the cafeteria that can be used as a venue. Councilmember Leonhard has concerns about cooking on the premises and discussion ensued.
213 214 215	Councilmember Sergia Cardenas has concerns with spending money for appliances and would rather they be directed towards speeding up move.

A meeting with VCS's lawyer has been set.

 - Waste water plant kick off meeting for design on June 6th at 11 am at Town Hall

 - Meeting with Security Company to get quote on surveillance cameras for various sites including the Water Tower and Chipper Jones. Will use information to get a grant proposal from T-Mobile

- the Power service panel at Airport posed a safety risk and was removed by the Power Company. No power to the Club house building, so it can now be demolished
- contacted glider club asking them to remove any personal belongings
- he had a meeting with the Flagler County Airport Director and learned better ways on how to manage an Airport
- he went to an Airport meeting discussion emergency operations after a disaster
- not having a key to the padlock of a fire hydrant flush box
- Facebook comments on the playground at Chipper Jones Park need to be looked at as they list a lot of valid issues. Cover up graffiti.

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- Mayor Bennett stated
 - that the graffiti can be covered up the next day
 - if anybody sees problems in the Town to please contact the Clerk or attend a meeting
 - that PW staff has been working diligently to empty trash cans
 - Vandals are abusing public parks
 - Cameras that are being ordered will hopefully reduce or eliminate vandalism

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Mrs. Spelorzi spoke on CSX memo and closures affecting Pierson.

8. GOOD AND WELFARE (public participation) 279 280 Residents in the audience inquired/spoke about 281 282 Disagreeing with not using outside vendors for the 4th of July festivities. Residents 283 have food trucks and stopping them for setting up is not community friendly. Mayor 284 Bennett explained. 285 • Why does the Town not have apartments or Tiny houses? Town Planner explained. 286 • When will codes be online.
