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24	a. Regular Meeting minutes November 4, 2025		
25 26 27	Mayor Gray Leonhard read the title and asked if there were any additions or deletions, if not he would entertain a motion for approval. Council Member Linnie Richardson made a motion to approve the above listed minutes as written; seconded by Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund. All agreed, motion carries.		
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31	5. NEW BUSINESS		
32	a. <u>Volusia County Sheriff Contract – Town Attorney Scott Simpson</u>		
33	Town Attorney Scott Simpson started off by apologizing for not reading that Sheriff office could		
34	not make contract retroactive. He continued with contract is pretty much as we discussed prior		
35	with the exception of taking out us of facility and it's a one-year contract with intentions of going		

back to regular contract as of next year. He proceeded with saying we don't know what is going

37 to happen with the Property tax amendment and everything could go to pot. We can now use next year to find an available option or find out you don't need it at all. Mayor Gray Leonhard asked a 38 question about the cost of 150,000 and Scott explained the highlighted copy is old contract and 39 the one on top is the final copy. Council member Brandy Peterson stated she is still where she 40 41 was before and asked, "We will still have 911 emergency. Town Attorney Scott Simpson stated 42 that you will only have 911 for emergencies but there is no law on time frame. Town Attorney Scott Simpson continued with the MSTU fund is for unincorporated Volusia County and not for 43 44 incorporated Volusia County or municipalities. We are in a unique situation that needs to be investigated. Council member Brandy Peterson but they do get some money from our 1500 45 residents. Mayor Gray Leonhard states other cities have patrol officers, but they don't have to 46 pay the contract because they already have a police force. Council Member Linnie Richardson 47 48 agrees with the mayor and why do they get services for free. Town Attorney Scott Simpson says 49 Oakhill, Debary, Deltona and us all pay for patrol services. They all contract to have someone here. We are paying them to patrol the Town limits. Town Planner Mark Karet states he lives in 50 Daytona and sees police vehicles, but they are usually drug force related I don't see them pulling 51 52 anyone over. Council member Brandy Peterson asks can we still talk to the county about putting 53 it on the taxes, Scott says the county levy unincorporated areas but yes, we can talk to them about coming up with a solution. Council member Linnie Richardson states she is highly 54 disappointed. Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund states that unless something drastically changes it's 55 just not going to be sustainable. Council member Brandy Peterson asks if we can continue 56 without a contract. Council member Linnie Richardson asks will our town laws be enforced. 57 Town attorney Scott Simpson states the enforce state law. Council member Linnie Richardson so 58 59 they can't enforce noise ordinance. Town Attorney Scott Simpson replies with noise ordinances 60 are hard to enforce because of the decibel reading. Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund says that he understands that you are disgruntled but we need to agree to the contract and work on finding 61 another solution because I think we will regret it if we do not sign this contract. Mayor Gray 62 63 Leonhard agrees with the Vice Mayor and ask if schedule will be random, Town attorney Scott 64 Simpson states that is at the discretion of the sheriff office. Town Planner Mark Karet asks if we can see how this plays out and maybe we won't even need patrol services. If we don't sign, then 65 you will have no patrol service and only 911 for emergencies and you won't know when they 66 67 will show up. Town attorney states it will not jeopardize the sheriff budget. With the property tax issue coming, no one will be able to afford to run their own police force. Deputy Clerk Ryan 68 69 Smith states Volusia County has never had an issue like this and if Pierson doesn't pay, they have never given us an answer on how they fund this we had the meeting with the County and the 70 Sheriff's office no one from finance, sheriff office or attorney. Pierson is the red headed stepchild 71 72 we have the highest agriculture population not a lot of growth. Town Attorney Scott Simpson 73 you are paying for an officer to patrol the Town limits and receive a monthly report, and they 74 will respond to 911 calls if you don't agree. Council member Linnie Richardson but our laws and 75 ordinances like the noise ordinance will not be enforced either way. Council Member Brandy 76 Peterson other than come to our meeting what do the really do. Resident Rick Davis stated you

- have discussed this for forty minutes; you were to decide if you approve or disapprove the
- 78 contract. Council explained they can only discuss this stuff at a meeting and resident Rick Davis
- 79 just turned and stormed out. Town attorney Scott Simpson states you need to approve for one
- year and then demand and push county to come up with a solution. Discussion ensued about
- property taxes going away. Town Planner Mark Karet says that he goes to several city meetings,
- and no one knows what is going to happen.
- Mayor Gray Leonhard asked the audience if they had anything that they wanted to say. Mayor Gray Leonhard said he would entertain a motion.

Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund is making a motion to approve sheriff contracts for one year: seconded by Council member Brandy Peterson. All agreed, roll call vote taken, motion carries.

b. Condemning Property in Pierson – Mayor Gray Leonhard

Mayor Gray Leonhard ask for council to table this item until he gets some more information.

Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund made a motion to approve tabling 5b condemning property in Pierson; seconded by Council Member Linnie Richardson. All agreed, motion carries.

c. Delinquent no re-rental airport – Council member Linnie Richardson

 Thank you, mayor, Ryan can you help me with this, Deputy Clerk Ryan Smith we had someone from eagle sport come in to under his name of Pat Anderson try to pay for a tie down for 2 days at 5 dollars a day and argued with Marci that it says that at the airport. He is with eagle sport and owes the town 800.00. Council member Linnie Richardson states we have to do something. Mayor Gray Leonhard states he associated with eagle sport and Emery Riddle. Council member Linnie Richardson asks Deputy clerk Ryan Smith was he an officer with Eagle sport, Ryan responds with yes. Town attorney Scott Simpson states you need a policy in place, Mayor Gray Leonhard states we have no airport policies but maybe we need some and add for a security deposit and first and last months rent, we had a gentlemen that removed his plane from airport and damaged the filed and we had to fix it at our cost. Town attorney Scott Simpson states if RFP does not work out then you need a policy for airport, and if RFP works out whoever is running it will have an operational manual. Council member Brandy Peterson maybe we should wait until after RFP.

d. Driveway to new well and old well- Mayor Gray Leonhard

We need to throw something down because new well gets muddy and chlorine truck may have problems and entering airport to get to old well is very wet also. Vice mayor Robert Greenlund says we should probably get quotes for millings and discussion ensued as who to call Rick large and Ronnie Council.

e. Sidewalk Quote Town Center – Council member Brady Peterson

121 I got a quote from right on concrete to fix sidewalk in front of town center and quote is for 122

\$ 1100.00. Discussion ensued and Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund agrees we need to get it fixed

123 prior to the Christmas celebration.

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Mayor Gray Leonhard asked the audience if they had anything that they wanted to say. Mayor Gray Leonhard said he would entertain a motion.

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Council Member Brandy Peterson made a motion to approve quote from right on concrete for \$ 1100.00 to fix sidewalk at town center and motion was seconded by Council Member Linnie Richardson. All agreed, motion carries.

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f. Traffic Safety Team Meeting – Lester Pulley

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The fatalities are slightly down; pedestrians are at 40% trouble with kids and US Highway 17 in Orange City. Sun rail is doing well. 750 kilo watts in not considered a motor vehicle and should not be on the streets we need to ask legislation to do something about it and that's all I have.

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6. OTHER BUSINESS (Mayor, Council and Staff Reports)

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Mayor Gray Leonhard starts off he received a letter that Duke Energy will be decreasing electric bills by 44.00 dollars. Council Member Linnie Richardson states it pertains to the hurricanes. Mayor Gray Leonhard states I see that one of the lights on the tower is working. Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund states we need to do something about North Road; discussion ensued and determined that dirt then lime rock, and sod would slow it down. Mayor Gray Leonhard states he will do a work order for our guys to take care of North Road. Council Member Linnie Richardson had nothing, Council member Brandy Peterson brings up quote to adding plugs, lights under walkways and cafeteria lights 8,500 dollars. And we can't wait until next meeting because we are getting close to the Christmas celebration. Discussion ensued. Council member Brandy Peterson states we need to use some money to make some money. Mayor Gray Leonhard agrees that they need to be fixed.

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Vice Mayor Robert Greenlund made a motion to approve quote at \$8,500.00 to replace lights and add plugs to outside of town center. Motion was seconded by Brandy Peterson. All agreed, motion carries.

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Council Member Brandy Peterson brings up Culvert on EAST Washington Ave and Deputy Ryan Smith states that the school board requested drawings and scope plan and agreed to proceed, and it will be getting done during Christmas break and we will have to detour residents to Blake Street. Town Planner states he has nothing but wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving to all. Town Planner Mark Karet starts with he will be here Thursday to meet with resident to discuss their zoning and land development questions, and Mayor asks Mark if he has a update from Todd about water system. Town Clerk Yvonne Braddock explains email she received from Pierson Wildcat Cheerleading and that they want to see if they can use a building on campus because the park where they practice is super wet. Discussion ensued and council has no problem with them using a building as long as they have insurance and children get waiver signed.
